

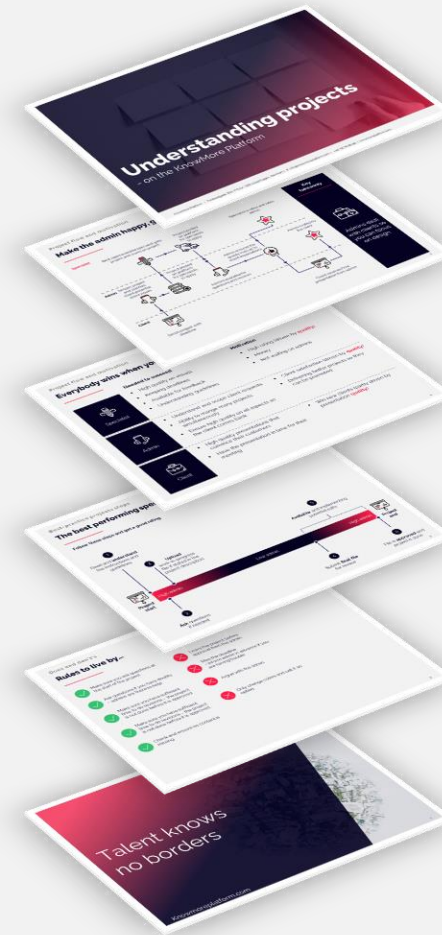

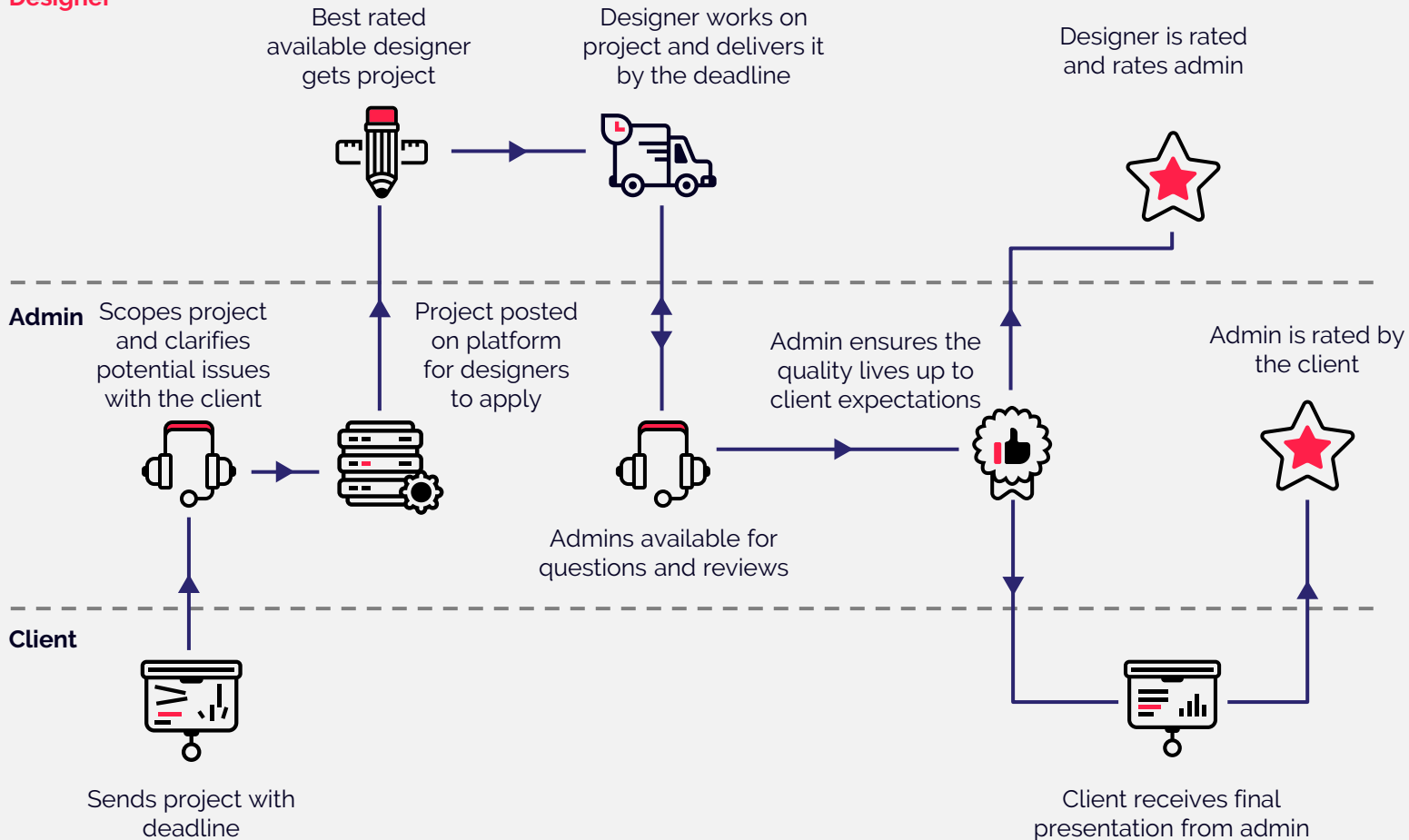

- Have the presentation in time for their meeting

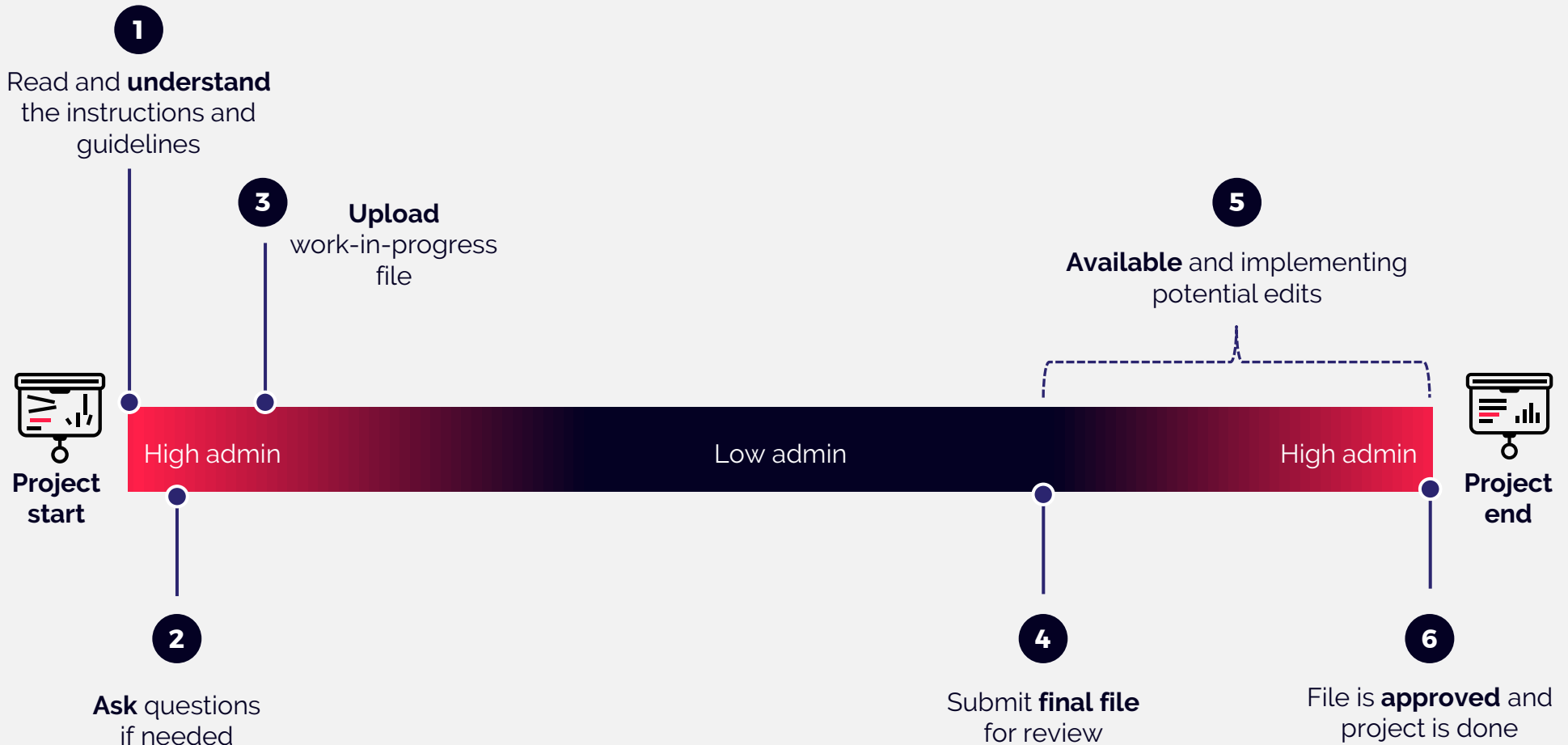
- Win new clients (partly driven by presentation **quality**)

## Rules to live by...

---

-  Make sure you ask questions at the start of the project
-  Ask questions if you have doubts  
- admins are there to help
-  Make sure you have sufficient time to do revisions – the project is not done before it is approved
-  Check and ensure no content is missing
-  Leave the project before approval from the admin
-  Miss the deadline  
- inform admin in advance if you are having trouble
-  Argue with the admin
-  Only change colors and call it an option
